Rajasthan to Introduce More Innovations to Ensure Road Safety

Pratap Singh Khachriyawas, Minister of Transport, Rajasthan expressed his deep sense of sorrow for each life being lost in road accidents in the State and was concerned about the increasing number of road accidents in the country. He stated that road safety is a shared responsibility that includes all the key stakeholders of the government, non-governmental organisations (NGOs), civil society organisations (CSOs) and common road users.

He further said though there are five key risk factors in road safety, the lack of self-discipline among road users is also one of the major reasons for accidents in the country. He shared his experiences of meeting the road safety victims and knowing about the miseries and sufferings these crash survivors are facing in their daily lives.

He was speaking in the first-ever '*Dialogue with Transport Minister, Rajasthan on Road Safety*' organised by CUTS on 'Effective Enforcement of Key Risk Factors: Opportunities and Challenges' on November 27, 2020, on a virtual platform.

George Cherian, Director, CUTS International moderated the webinar and spoke about five key risk factors of road safety, such as high speed; drunk driving; failure to wear helmets and seat belts; child restraints; and not obeying road safety rules. More than 50 participants attended the webinar.

Marking the first anniversary of the Motor Vehicles Amendment Act, 2019 another webinar entitled 'One year of MVA Act, 2019: Learning from Pandemic and Way Forward' was organised on October 06, 2020.

There is a strong need of having a road safety day in India to bring the focus of all stakeholders on the importance of road safety, said Pradeep S. Mehta, Secretary General CUTS International. He further said that though the attitude of drivers, in general, is changing a bit after the passage of the new act, due to the provision of hefty penalties, there has to be strict enforcement coupled with awareness and education to change the behaviours of common road users.

T Elangovan, Executive Director, Kerala Road Safety Authority, Government of said that Kerala has been able to reduce deaths and accidents on roads up to 30 percent. He further said that Kerala is far ahead of the rest of the states in the digital monitoring of traffic violations. He also shared the lessons learned related to the functioning of the Kerala Road Safety Authority.

Amrita Duhan, Superintendent of Police (Head Quarters), Rajasthan Police, Government of Rajasthan opined that the Rajasthan government has saved more than 1600 lives on roads in the first six months of 2020. She also spoke about the Golden Hour application, Integrated Road Accident Database (iRAD) support for data management and other digital initiatives for road safety.

More than 50 participants from across states, media representatives, government officials and civil society representatives participated in the webinar.

Promoting Organic Consumption in Rajasthan

A partner's orientation meeting under the project entitled, 'Promoting Organic Consumption in the State of Rajasthan' was organised on October 28, 2020. The main objective of this meeting was to get feedback from partners about the activities conducted and plan for phase 2022-2026.

A total of 71 *Gram Panchayat* level awareness campaigns were organised in all the project districts during October-December 2020. The main objective of these meetings was to create mass awareness among producers and consumers about the benefits of organic production as well as consumption.

About 50 block-level awareness campaigns were also held in the project districts to materialise the advocacy and policy-related issues and combine them for a particular district related to sustainable consumption.

Four farmer's training and exposure visits were organised in the project districts to build the capacity of farmers who are willing to shift towards organic farming. Other than these, two knowledge-sharing meetings on community-managed seed cells and one organic fair were also organised.



Raising Consumer Awareness on Environmental Issues

Green Action Week (GAW) India is a joint partnership between the Swedish Society for Nature Conservation (SSNC) and CUTS International since 2017. The purpose of the intervention is to organise short-term campaign activities to raise consumer awareness on environmental issues in different parts of the country through partner CSOs.

This year the theme was 'Sharing Community'. 11 CSOs were selected to be part of the campaign in 2020. During GAW, which was from September 28-October 04, 2020 CSOs organised campaign activities on Sharing Community in their respective states.

In October-December 2020, the team visited Raipur (Chhattisgarh), Bhubaneswar, Berhampur (Odisha), Lucknow (UP) and Bengaluru. GAW India partners meet was organised at Jaipur on December 22, 2020, where all partner organisations shared their campaign experiences.

Partner organisations delivered presentations on the campaign activities, impact, challenges and the way forward. In an open discussion, participants shared their views about the theme and future strategies.



Visit to Ministries/FSSAI

Cheriyan and Madhu Sudan Sharma visited the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) and met Arun Singhal, CEO, FSSAI; N Bhaskar and Sunil Bakshi, Advisers at FSSAI on October 14, 2020, and had detailed discussions on trans-fatty acids, front-of-package labels and other issues.

Both visited the Department of Consumer Affairs on October 15, 2020, and met with Leena Nandan, Secretary, Consumer Affairs; Nidhi Khare, Additional Secretary and Anupam Mishra, Joint Secretary and updated them about CUTS activities and ongoing initiatives on consumer protection.

Also met with Priyank Bharati, Joint Secretary, (Road Safety) and Vivek Kishore, Director, Road Safety, Ministry of Road, Transport & Highways to discuss a wide range of issues and emphasised the need for urgent notification of the rules related to standards of helmets.

SDG 12: Responsible Consumption and Production

The Meeting of the Think Tank Group on Sustainable Consumption was held on December 09-10, 2020. In addition to reviewing the decisions taken during the meeting on September 22, 2020, it discussed the design of the anthology and opportunities for advocacy on SDG12 during 2021, including the UN High-level Political Forum. Cheriyan attended the meeting.

Spotlighting Role of Human Rights' Defenders

CUTS organised a Manifestation on International Human Rights Day on December 10, 2020. 212 land and environmental defenders were killed in 2019 alone, a 30 percent rise from the 164 killed in 2018. Around 40 percent were indigenous people and traditional landowners. This is an alarming trend of shrinking civic space threatening our democratic values. The world needs to stand up for the rights of environmental defenders to defend our common future, that was the message of the manifestation to honour the world's environmental defenders by lighting a candle.



Commemoration of World Day of Remembrance

CUTS commemorated the World Day of Remembrance, 2020 on November 12, 2020. The team reached out to Khachariyawas, Ravi Jain, Transport Commissioner, Rajasthan and Anand Siddhu, Deputy Commissioner of Police (Traffic), Jaipur on this occasion. The team prepared placards of key road safety messages and took photographs with all the mentioned dignitaries. All the dignitaries appreciated CUTS efforts being made for road safety victims in Rajasthan.



2020 Marks CI's 60th Anniversary

Consumers International (CI) organised various activities, talks by dignitaries and regional specific member calls, during the week of November 16-20, 2020 to commemorate the 60th anniversary. Cherian attended the Asia-Pacific Regional Members meeting and spoke about the new



challenges in the region. Aradhana Gupta attended a special address by Mukhisa Kituyi, Secretary-General, United Nations Conference on Trade and Development as a young representative on November 20, 2020.
