Experts Disapprove Proposed Regulations for FoPL Nutrition Rating

G iven the fast-paced nature of modern society, where convenience often takes precedence over nutrition, it becomes vital to increase awareness about the health impact of ultra-processed foods and the crucial role that Front of Pack Labelling (FoPL) could play in addressing this concern. This need for awareness is significant in light of the increasing prevalence of non-communicable diseases (NCDs) in both urban and rural areas of India, as recently indicated by a study conducted by the Indian Council of Medical Research-India Diabetes (ICMR-INDIAB).

To promote healthier choices and address the role of certain ingredients in contributing to NCDs, incorporating simplified nutrition information on the front of food packages proves to be a costeffective strategy. By providing clear and easily understandable information about the content of salt, sugar, and fat, consumers can be guided towards making informed choices and avoiding unhealthy options.



Moreover, implementing such easy-to-understand warning labels would compel food industries, which have shown little commitment to safeguarding consumer health, to reformulate their products by reducing harmful ingredients and enhancing their nutritional content. Such a move would lead to an overall enhancement in the healthiness of the available food options.

These were the opinions expressed by experts in the state-level consultation organised by CUTS in Bangalore on July 28, 2023, in partnership with Public Affairs Foundation (PAF), to generate awareness on FoPL and the role it could play in curbing NCDs among wider stakeholders.

Deepak Saxena, Associate Director, CUTS International; Uma, Joint Director, Department of Health & Family Welfare (NCD Cell), Government of Karnataka; Sanjay Pandey, National Consultant, Global Health Advocacy; Sarika, Founder, Principal Consultant, Food Safety and Simi TB, CUTS International presented the status of NCDs in India.

Similarly, another consultation was organised at Bhopal with National Centre for Human Settlements & Environment (NCHSE) on August 17, 2023, where Dr Prabhakar Tiwari, CMHO; Dr Varuna Pathak, HoD, Obstetrics Gynaecology, R K Medical College, Bhopal; Devendra Dubey, Senior Food Safety Officer, Food & Drugs Administration, MP and Dr Pradip Nandi, Director General, NCHSE presented their views.



Under C20, the working group on 'Delivering Democracy: Retrospect and Prospect' is one such group, which is organising multiple in-person knowledge assimilation events and roundtables, incorporating its various sub-themes at the national and regional levels. One of the regional roundtables for the north region was organised by CUTS International in Jaipur on June 07, 2023.



The roundtable featured a diverse group of participants from various sectors and states. The Chief Guest was Member of Parliament Ram Charan Bohra, and the keynote speaker was Kamal Chandra Yogi, a Professor from Central Sanskrit University. Rajib Dasgupta, Head of Research at Grassroots Research and Advocacy Movement also attended the roundtable.

The event saw the presence of PRI members, including Pradhans (Panchayat Sarpanch or Zila Parishad members) who were honoured by the Prime Minister of India for their innovative development initiatives aimed at promoting people's participation in a transparent and accountable manner. In addition to them, Mayors, Deputy Mayors (both current and former), representatives from urban local bodies (ULBs), civil society organisations (CSOs), and media representatives actively participated in the discussions.

The roundtable also had the presence of retired bureaucrats, development researchers, social activists on women, gender, Dalit rights and youth empowerment, Domain experts of Indian heritage, philosophy and culture, and youth and tribal movement activists. Enhancing City Governance *Capacity Building for Municipal Officials*

To enhance the knowledge of municipal officials on urban issues, CUTS organised a Capacity Building Workshop at Jaipur, Rajasthan for ULB officials on May 25, 2023, under the project 'Improving City Governance' supported by the Australian High Commission.

D Sudhakar, Expert in Solid Waste Management delivered sessions on solid waste management, sustainable transportation and community participation. Kamaldeep Sharma, State Nodal Person, 15th Finance Commission spoke about the financial status of Rajasthanbased ULBs and presented ways to improve resources. Himani Tiwari, State Nodal Person for Capacity Building at the Department of Local Self Governance, Government of Rajasthan, emphasised the importance of empowering city managers through capacity building to effectively implement government schemes.



Amar Deep Singh, CUTS made a presentation on CUTS urban interventions and the need for capacity building of ULB officials. More than 30 participants, including officials from Jaipur Municipal Corporation Heritage and Greater along with CSOs working on urban governance participated. Participants appreciated the training workshop emphasising its value in enhancing service delivery by city governments.

7th UN Global Road Safety Week (May 15-21, 2023)

CUTS actively participated in the 7th CUN Global Road Safety Week from May 15-21, 2023. They organised various online and social media activities and joined events by GRSP partners in India and international organisations like the Global Alliance of NGOs on Road Safety. A webinar titled 'Rethinking Speeding and Helmet Issues in India: Challenges and Solutions' was organised on May 19, 2023, with prominent speakers, including officials from MoRTH, AIIMS, and experts from different states. The



webinar had a total of 11 speakers and over 60 participants. from Kerala Road Safety Authority were the main speakers.

Stakeholder's Sensitisation Workshop: Sustainable Consumption Production

CUTS is working towards developing a culture of sustainable consumption and production by Cengaging consumers in selected seven cities of Rajasthan under the ProScop project. Recently stakeholders' sensitisation programmes were organised in these cities to sensitise relevant stakeholders including government officials, public representatives, policymakers, consumer groups, organisations working on environmental issues and media. Thoughts about sustainable consumption and best practices for sustainable lifestyles were shared by the speakers and participants during these programmes.
