Ministry of Ayush to Work in Tandem with Ministry of Tourism to Promote Medical Value Travel

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The Ministry of Ayush signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the India Tourism Development Corporation (ITDC), the Ministry of Tourism, to work together for the promotion of Medical Value Travel in Ayurveda and other traditional systems of medicine, informed Minister of Ayush, Shri Sarbananda Sonowal in a written reply in Rajya Sabha.

In an important move, a senior government official, on the condition of anonymity, told media that various options are being examined keeping in view of the financial implications and the challenges in implementing the plan of Ayushman 2.0 that would have wide application on the lines of Ayushman Bharat.

On a different note, there have been a big concern regarding the absence of a legal framework governing this fast growing segment of the Pharma Retailing Business, which is causing confusion in the industry. Online pharmacies have been under the scanner in India for some time in the absence of a comprehensive law for this emerging space.

Stressing a need for Research and Innovation, Union Minister for Health and Family Welfare, Mansukh Mandaviya stated that these are necessary for the sustained growth of pharmaceuticals sector.

Besides, India's work on Single-Window Portal for Drug Regulation Processes System will bring together stakeholders like manufacturers, distributors, state-run agencies to ensure quality. Seeking to revamp India's drug regulatory system, the government is working on a Unified Digital Portal that will bring together all stakeholders: regulators, manufacturers, distributors, state-run departments, and procurement agencies.

Officials of Indian Council of Medical Research and All India Institute of Medical Sciences are of the view that ratings will be ineffective in curbing consumption of unhealthy foods and direct warning labels would be more effective.

Deliberation on lessons learnt and sharing of best practices and experiences by the membership can help build effective solutions for bridging the divide in digital capabilities and addressing regulatory barriers.

In 2019 as per World Health Statistics -2022- the life expectancy of Indian women at birth was 72.2 as against 69.5 for males. The <u>Healthy Life Expectancy</u> at birth of women was 60.4 in 2019. However, the maternal mortality rate is significantly worrying for India, i.e., 145 (per 100 000 live births) as of 2017. In a nutshell, women live substantially longer with disabilities. Gender dissimilarities are less as women excel in all spheres of life and parents-in-law emotionally and financially.

FSSAI said in a statement that it has "directed states/UTs to deploy Food Safety on Wheels (FSW) mobile food testing vans, to check adulteration of milk and milk products considering the festive season of Holi".

Government Mulls Regulation, Crackdown on E- Pharmacies Amid Concerns Over Data Privacy, Malpractices Economic Times/Industry March 13, 2023	The Union Health Ministry is mulling regulations and stringent action against <u>e-Pharmacies</u> , including banning them completely, following concerns over data privacy, malpractices in the sector, and irrational sale of drugs, official sources said on Monday. The revised draft of the New Drugs, Medical Devices and Cosmetics Bill, 2023, which has been sent for inter-ministerial consultation, states, "The central government may regulate, restrict or prohibit the sale or distribution of any drug by online mode, by notification."
