Prescribe Generic Medicines or Face Action: Govt. Tells Medicine Practitioners 01 May-31 May, 2023

The Centre has warned the central government hospital doctors and CGHS wellness centres to comply with the norms of prescribing generic medicines failing which, stern action would be taken against them. Govt. also asked doctors to completely curtail visits of medical representatives.

On the other side, according to the new notification by National Medical Commission, doctors now will get an UID for doctors to be able to practice medicine in the country, as per the new regulations by the NMC. UID will be generated centrally by the NMC ethics board and thereby grant the practitioner, registration in NMR and eligibility to practice medicine in India.

In another matter, The Advertisement Monitoring Committee at the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India flagged 32 fresh cases of food business operators (FBOs) making misleading claims and advertisements. They were found to be in contravention of the Food Safety and Standards (Advertisements & Claims) Regulations, 2018.

In an interesting move, the Union Government is likely to make good manufacturing practice (GMP) mandatory for all units manufacturing drugs in the country to maintain quality of drugs produced and exported from India. The move comes even as India's drugs regulator has sought to crack down on poor quality drugs.
